Caution: This portion of the Caribou Bog Ski Trail shares a snowmobile trail

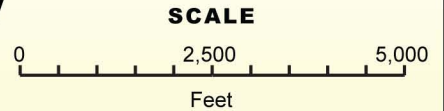
The trail crossing the Smith Farm, owned by the University of Maine, is rarely groomed
