2023 Annual Meeting: Save the Date, May 19!

OLT is sending you this short newsletter to update you with some changes to the calendar this year. The 2023 **OLT Annual Meeting will be held on Friday, May 19** this year, hopefully in-person. We are delaying to allow for better weather, when we might be able to open windows and offer a safe, fresh-air gathering for our members. Classic and freestyle events slated for at Caribou Bog Ski Race

Note: At press time, we realize that this newsletter will be reaching readers approximately about the time of the CBCA Ski Races. This info bears repeating. OLT Board member Dan Baumert is Race Director and has prepared this (edited) report.

The 2023 Caribou Bog Ski Race will be held in February on the Caribou Bog Conservation Area (CBCA) trails, Taylor Road in Orono. A separate classic and freestyle race will be held on consecutive Sundays. The scheduled days for both races and backup dates, if needed, are as follows:

Sunday Feb. 5th, 2023 Classic Race Sunday Feb. 12th, 2023 Freestyle Race Saturday Feb. 18th, 2023 First Backup Date Saturday Feb. 25th, 2023 Second Backup Date

This year the classic race may be part of the New England Nordic Ski Association (NENSA) marathon series. A bid was submitted to NENSA to include the classic race as part of the marathon series. If chosen for the NENSA marathon series, the classic race will have a long marathon distance of about 30K with a shorter 20K marathon distance option and a 10K distance option for the more recreational skiers. Snow conditions would dictate the actual course. If lighter snow conditions prevail, multiple laps can be done to get the longer race distances.

After the freestyle race, a short "kids" race is also being planned for this year. All skill levels and ages are welcome.

A portion of both races will be on some of the trails that have been improved with the Veazie Railroad Trail grant this past summer. The new CBCA Outdoor Center will be used for registration, timing and awards.

As always, **volunteers are essential** for running a smooth race. As the race date approaches, specific volunteer needs and sign-up will be posted on the Penobscot Valley Ski Club (PVSC) web site. Online registration and race updates also will be on the PVSC web site. Last year over 100 skiiers participated in the classic and freestyle races combined. This year it is anticipated those numbers will increase. The Caribou Bog Ski Race is a great opportunity to showcase the winter use of the Caribou Bog Conservation Area trails and new trail center.

Trail cams reveal the wildlife that surrounds us

Recent photos capture the wealth of wildlife in the Orono area.

OLT has done extensive work over 30+ years to restore wetlands and steward forests for recreation and habitat. Our work is a balance - you may have seen



signs for seasonal trail closures for nesting, as well as trails opened and groomed to encourage winter sports.

OLT is studying the lands in the Caribou Bog Conservation Area (CBCA) area. Timber cruises provide a survey of trees that supply food and shelter for animals, insects and birds. Trees enrich the microscopic life in the soil. Plants are identified, both native and invasive, as a baseline for future study. Watersources are recorded, especially vernal pools so essential to amphibious life. Migrating birds can often be seen at CBCA wetlands. Forestry at OLT is practiced with an emphasis on birds, as so many species have disappeared from these regions in the last few decades. An inventory provides information through time.

Trail camera photographs remind us of the creatures we don't always get to see. Wildlife and humans live and play side-by-side here: We hope these photos inspire wonder and a love of this beautiful place that the Penobscot people call "the Dawnland."


